Our PPIE efforts are crucial to our mental health research across various areas, reflecting our commitment to including diverse voices in mental health research.

For EPICare, we've collaborated with academic stakeholders as well as our 'experts by lived experience' (LEAG) group, to shape EPICare.

The LEAG group has:

- Helped with the CareLoop App Design by providing input on language, feature order, and data visibility, leading to key modifications like improved phrasing.
- Assisted with onboarding materials by helping refine the clinician script introducing the CareLoop app. They participated in live discussions and email reviews, shaping both the script and an onboarding video.
- Provided feedback on the Website & Logo Design, including images, colours, and fonts.

What is **EPI**Care?

EPICare is an innovative, NIHR-funded initiative designed to revolutionise mental health care through data-driven insights.

Part of the Midlands Mental Health Mission, EPICare equips clinicians with essential tools to enhance decision-making and improve patient outcomes.

How will **EPI**Care help?

- **EPICare Dashboard:** View caseloads, track patient progress, and get notifications for missing PROMs and NICE standards.
- **National Registry:** Standardised, anonymised data to improve psychosis care across the country.
- **Optional: CareLoop EI App:** A patient-friendly mobile app for collecting valuable PROM data, seamlessly feeding into EPICare's system

Why **EPI**Care?

Early Intervention in Psychosis (EIP) services provide crucial support, but only 30-40% of patients make a full recovery. EPICare will include all service users, aged 14-65 years, receiving treatment for first-episode psychosis (FEP) in EIP services. EPICare aims to improve clinical decision-making at all levels of Early Intervention for Psychosis care, ensure timely, evidence-based interventions and reduce disparities in care and improve patient outcomes.

The **Dashboard** will

- Provide real-time insights into patient progress
- Track and meet NICE quality standards as well as NCAP audit standards
- Identify and reduce inequalities in care
- Help shape better treatments for psychosis
